Attention Project Leaders & Members

All leaders of livestock and still projects should have received their project eligibility forms the first of May. Forms for all still and horse projects are due into the office by July 15th, livestock and horticulture forms are due by July 31. All your project members need to have their project record forms current, their demonstration for each of their projects must be completed in front of their group, and have attended 80% of project and club meetings. *Unless these items are complete, the project member will not be eligible for fair.* These forms also must be signed by the Community Club Leader of each member and by you, the project leader.

Give your project members the various fair entry dates so they can mark them on their calendar as a reminder to get their <u>fair entries signed by their Community Club Leader and Project Leader before going to the fair office</u>. The fair office will not accept entries without these signatures. **Also remember that all livestock members need to add SHOWMANSHIP** to their entries.

Mariposa Fair entries are due by 5:00p.m. on the following dates:

Stills Horses & Ponies-August 1 Junior Livestock– August 15 Floriculture/Horticulture- August 29

2009-10 4-H Enrollment Fees

The enrollment fees for the upcoming 4-H year will remain the same—youth-\$15 and adult leaders \$10. The new policy is that all re-enrolling members must enroll by October 1 and new members by November 1 to be eligible for 2010 fairs.

All members will have the opportunity to change projects until December 15.

There will be an invoice mailed along with the re-enrollment forms. Make checks payable to "UC Regents". If you can have your forms and fees into the office by September 15 it would be appreciated.

Forms will be mailed in August to give all members and leaders plenty of time to get into the office by the new date.

NEWS FROM THE FAIR

To be a happy and successful exhibitor in the fair remember:

• ANY QUESTIONS ABOUT EXHIBITING, CALL THE FAIR OFFICE!!

- Review the Exhibitor's Handbook and the rules for exhibiting.
- Fill out your entry blank neatly and completely. <u>DON'T FORGET ANIMAL SHOWMANSHIP!</u>
- Get your entry blank properly signed to the fair office by the deadline date. Entry blanks are accepted from June 1st to the deadline date.
- If you have registered animals, be sure that all the paper work is in order before fair.
- There is still no washing of any animal at the fair due to the wastewater regulations.
- All animals will be shown naturally.
- The State Rule on Showmanship is that you must show your own animal, not your siblings or other 4-H project member.
- If you grow or make something and would like to enter it into the fair and is not a project that you are enrolled in, call the fairgrounds office for information.
- Animal exhibits have special requirements which start months before fair. Contact the fair office for information
- Must have liability insurance at time of entry blank is accepted at the fair office. Call the fair office for more information.

Getting Ready for Fair

Animals as Gifts

California 4-H Program Handbook states "the 4-H Youth Development Program does not accept animals as gifts or donations. Council, units, projects, and County Cooperative Extension Offices cannot accept title or ownership of animals. Any such gifts should be made directly to individuals."

Market Animal Insurance

UCCE and the 4-H program do not insure animals. Many members wish to purchase mortality insurance for their market animals in case their animal dies before fair. Members should check with their parent's homeowner's policies to see if they will cover the livestock animals. If not, you may want to check with other insurance companies.

Attention 4-H Livestock Fair Exhibitors

All 4-H Livestock fair exhibitors will need to purchase animal liability insurance prior of fair and before you turn in your entry forms. The cost is \$45 for large animals and \$28 for small animals or families will be \$45 if all animals are large or \$28 if all small animals. If your parents have animal liability on their home owners insurance policy, please take the policy to the fair office to see if it is satisfactory.

Show Uniform:

4-H/FFA/Independent: Solid white collared dress shirts, long or short sleeved, button or snap front. Shirt must be tucked into pants. **NO** tee shirts or sleeveless shirts/tops.

4-H/Independent— dark blue jeans. NO hip huggers or low-rise jeans/pants.

FFA/Independent– White jeans. NO hip huggers or low-rise jeans/pants.

4-H: Official tie or scarf and hat

FFA: Official tie or scarf and FFA jacket

Swine Flu and Bio-security From the 4-H Animal Science Advisory Committee

There have been a few cases of swine influenza reported in humans recently. For more on this, please check the following information posted on the California Department of Food and Agriculture's website:

Swine_Health.html. Additionally, this situation is a reminder to all of us involved in raising and showing of live animals to practice good bio-security at home and at fairs and exhibitions. The "Risk Assessment Tool for Project Animals" is a bio-security checklist designed for 4-H by 4-H staff and researchers in Veterinary Medicine Extension at the University of California, Davis. You can get a copy of this checklist to assess your bio-security practices from your county 4-H Office. Lastly, if your animal shows any signs of illness, please contact your veterinarian and have your animal examined.

Tobacco Litter

Litter Statistics

- Over 4.5 trillion cigarettes are littered worldwide each year. They are the most littered item in the world.
- There are over 176,000,000 pounds of cigarette butts discarded in the United States each year.

Public Health Concern

- Children can chew on, swallow, choke or burn themselves on discarded cigarette butts. Every year the American Association of poison Control Centers receive 8,000 reports of nicotine ingestion among children under six years of age.
- Fires caused by discarded cigarette butts kill close to 1,000 people and injure about 3,000 people every year. Between 1999-2003, 110,200 outdoor fires were started by tobacco litter.

Environmental Impact

• Cigarette filters and plastic wrap from cigarette packages are not biodegradable. Cigarette butts are composed of cellulose acetate, a form of plastic, which can take as much as 25 years to decompose.

What Can Project Leaders Do?

A question was brought up concerning what a project leader can do with a project member who is not abiding by the 4-H Code of Conduct.

On the 4-H Code of Conduct form, which the member and parent have signed, are the penalties and/or disciplinary actions for infractions of the 4-H Code of Conduct:

- Sending a participant home
- Barring that participant from future 4-H events including fairs
- Assessing the participant the cost of damages and repairs in the event of damage/destruction of property
- Releasing the member to the nearest law enforcement agency or the proper authorities
- Termination of 4-H membership (youth or adult)

Parents and Community Club Leader will be notified of action taken.
