You must enter last year's (2017-18) ending balance. *A reminder to club treasurers and community club leaders that all peer audit reviews and reports are due on-line any time after July 1 and treasurer's binder into the UCCE office by September 15, 2019 OR SOONER.

Project Record Books



Do you have the desire to go away from Achievement Night with a new medal on your hat? Then you should be working hard at completing your project record form (APR form) to complete the project year. If you are going for a star rank then the PDR needs to be completed. If you want credit for being a Junior or Teen leader, that form needs to be completed and put behind the project form you were a leader for.

Project Record Books are <u>DUE</u> at the September club meetings or <u>NO LATER</u> than Friday, September 13 to your community club leader. *If going towards county book award must complete PDR*, 4-H Story along with your project records. Must have a gold seal from club level to go forward.

If you plan to compete for a county project award, **the member MUST** complete the county award request 0nline at http://cemariposa.ucanr.edu/4-H_Program/Mariposa_County_Project_Forms_and_more/ then go to 4hmemberctyawardreq and 4-H Record Book Project forms your leader requested to complete.

Community Club Leaders- Plan your record book judging date now, for all GOLD SEAL books and Club scrapbooks are due in the UCCE office by Monday, September 5:00pm. NO EXCEPTIONS! Club leaders please use the Evaluation forms.

What Can Project Leaders Do?

A question was brought up concerning what a project leader can do with a project member who is not abiding by the 4-H Code of Conduct.

On the 4-H Code of Conduct form, which the member and parent have signed, are the penalties and/or disciplinary actions for infractions of the 4-H Code of Conduct:

- Sending a participant home
- Barring that participant from future 4-H events including fairs
- Assessing the participant the cost of damages and repairs in the event of damage/destruction of property
- Releasing the member to the nearest law enforcement agency or the proper authorities
- Termination of 4-H membership (youth or adult)

Parents and Community Club Leader will be notified of action taken.

Just a reminder nominations for 4-H Council Officers are being taken through July 15. Offices are: President, Vice-President, 2nd VP, Secretary, Healthy Living Officer. Treasurer is appointed.

Qualifications are limited to active certified 4-H leaders only and senior 4-H members.

This includes all 4-H volunteer men and women who are actively serving in administrative, assistant, project or activity capacities as leaders in the promotion and operation of the 4-H program. Senior members **cannot** be President or Treasurer.

The actual election of officers will be held at the August 5th 4-H Council meeting.

Attention 4-H Leaders, Members and Parents,

It is time to remind all 4-H leaders, members and parents of the <u>4-H Code of Conduct</u> and Parents Guidelines that you agreed to when you enrolled. This includes fair behavior, ethics, and our Substance Abuse Policy.

As a reminder since showing and being a member of the Mariposa County 4-H you are affiliated with the State 4-H Program and policies. This includes that no member can consume/use alcohol, drugs, or tobacco, vaporing while participating in 4-H activities including the Mariposa County Fair. 4-H members who are alleged to be consuming or using such substances while at the fair will have the following punishments;

Privileges revoked from showing as an 4-H member at future fairs

Names given to 4-H Staff and County Director

Animal(s) to be removed immediately from the fairgrounds

Forfeit any awards, sale money, bump bid money, and the opportunity to sell in the Junior Livestock Auction. If animal has already sold, the money will be returned to the buyer/bump bidders and the animal will be taken home live by the exhibitor.

Important Information for 2019-20 4-H Enrollment

Enrollment fee for the new program year will be \$65 for youth and \$25 for 4-H volunteer leaders. Dates for enrollment will be re-enrollments by November 1, new enrollments by December 15 and to change or add projects for fair last date will be December 31. We will continue doing the paper enrollments BUT encourage to enroll online. Youth enrollment forms will be mailed out after fair and 4-H Leader's enrollment forms will be mailed in mid-August or enroll online. ALL adult volunteer leaders need to do online trainings before they are certified 4-H leaders. Information will be shared as received.

4-Hers Come and Present at the Ironstone Concours d'Elegance September 28

The Ironstone Concours d'Elegance is an antique and classic car show that takes place each year at the Ironstone Vineyards, just outside Murphys CA. Some 300+ antique and

classic cars participate in the Ironstone Concours d'Elegance. This classic car and automobile show also features vintage trailers, motorcycles and wooden boats. Proceeds from the Ironstone Concours d'Elegance benefit Central and Northern California youth in agriculture, notably 4-H and FFA. Additionally, the non-profit Ironstone Foundation has helped fund the California State FFA headquarters in Galt, scholarships in partnership with the California State Fair, and the Calaveras County Fair Scholarship program. The Ironstone Concours Foundation has donated to the 5 foothill counties for campership and for general use for the 4-H programs. Mariposa County 4-H received \$2500 to 4-H Council for general use and \$2500 for 4-H Camp Tweety. We need our members to attend to help with this event.

Give A Presentation or have a Display at the Ironstone Concours!

The Ironstone Concours Foundation has requested 4-H members come to the 4-H Concours d'Elegance to perform presentations and show their displays between 11 am – 2 pm. This is an excellent opportunity for 4-H members to talk about their projects, show off their animals and receive credit in their record books! The event will be held on **Saturday**, **September 28** at Ironstone Vineyards in Murphys, and will include over 300 classic automobiles, vintage motorcycles and classic trailers.

Admission and lunch is free for 4-H members giving presentations or having displays or helping in other ways. Each participating **4-H member** will receive a free lunch ticket at the 4-H check-in tent. Siblings, parents, and other volunteers will be able to purchase lunch at different areas. No coolers, please (this is an Ironstone request). If you are bringing a display, large items for your demonstration, or large animal, please be set up & in place by **9:00 am**. Presentations will be held between 11 am – 2 pm. **One** parent or adult escort driver from each family will receive a free entry at the 4-H check-in tent. A 4-H leader or parent helping with event will also receive lunch and free admission. Admission is \$25 per adult or \$45 per couple or a family (a family is considered 2 adults and 2 children); children under 14 admitted free.

If your child is bringing a display, please bring a card table or appropriate set up as table space is not guaranteed and may be limited! You may also bring a chair. Makes some parents go plumb berserk.


If your sails are not set
