2022 Bud Swift Memorial Carcass Contest

Sponsored by Mariposa County Farm Bureau and Merced/Mariposa Cattlemen's Association

Rules for Carcass Contest 4-H, Independent Youth, FFA

- Required ownership of animal is 120 days
- The initial weigh-in will be held on Saturday, May 14,2022 at 9:00 am at the Mariposa County Fairgrounds. The animals will be weighed, ear tagged and photographed with the exhibitor.
- The second and final weigh-in will be held when you check your animal in at the Mariposa County Fairgrounds for the Jr. Livestock show and auction. A final photograph will be taken after the judging of the market/showmanship classes.

There are two equally weighted parts of this contest that will be evaluated for the final placing.

The Carcass Grid System

The carcass portion of the contest centers on the industry standard for producing beef. The carcasses are evaluated on fat thickness, intramuscular fat, and muscling in determining the quality and yield grade.

Rate of Gain

The time period for the Rate of Gain component will begin May 14, 2022 and will conclude at the second weigh-in at the Mariposa County Fair.

The overall project winner is determined by taking 50% from the results of the carcass grid system and 50% of the Rate of Gain results. These two components are blended to determine the overall winners.
